On-Line Learning

This has been a steep learning curve for all and I want to let you know that we have taken your comments on board. After half term, I will publish detailed guidance about how our on-line learning is evolving.

Towards A "New Normal"

Preparations for admitting Years 10 and 12 are based on the 2 metre social distancing rule. Classrooms have been re-configured and there are lots of signs and floor markings in place throughout the corridors. If social distancing measures are reduced to 1 metre indoors and 2 metres outdoors, as indicated by the Chief Minister in yesterday's press briefing, then we will amend our plans. We are already in touch with the parents of students in Years 10 and 12, who have indicated that their children will return when schools are able to open more fully. Students in these year groups will receive their timetables on Tuesday 16th June. Uniform will not be required for the rest of this academic year.

Clearly, the likely intention to relax restrictions will be another positive step for our island. I am hopeful that we will soon have a greater degree of routine for everyone.

Over the next fortnight, we would like our students to take a well-deserved break. As we ask your child to put away school books and computers for the next two weeks, we hope you enjoy the rest too. It gives me great pleasure to officially announce that "Home School is out" for half term!
