Thank you to all who took part in the Year 7 Futsal Tournament over the past month. All teams played some fantastic futsal throughout the competition.


Hillary secured the win in the 3rd vs 4th place play-off, and a huge congratulations to Patrick, who beat Langness 2-1 in the closely contested final!
